- If residents are certain of a crime happening repeatedly, request the Crime Suppression Unit (CSU). CSU is a statistics-driven unit. They are identifiable by the all black gear w/vests printed with 'POLICE' on them. Call in and report the time frames and area of illegal activity to request CSU presence.

- Presented six (6) initiatives of Strategic Plan:
 - Community Stability & Inclusiveness
 - Economic Development
 - Community Building
 - Association Operational Effectiveness
 - Education & Learning
 - Safety & Quality of Life
- Voting on Strategic Plan was deferred to give residents an opportunity to pay dues in order to have voting status and for residents to review
- There was a question as to how the Strategic Planning Committee fit in the organization structure, i.e is this a standing committee? Parlimentarian reminded members that President can appoint a committee at will.

352 University Update - James Harris

- 352 University is a Annie E. Casey Foundation owned site of 28 acres
- Focus: Jobs and Community Development (vs. retail)
- Development focused on NPU-V and Capitol View Manor
- The railroad on the property will be purchased from CSX in 5-6 months which moves the project timeline up from 5-7 years to 3-5 years
- 25% of property will be dedicated to food distribution
- 25% of property will be dedicated to craft/trainable jobs (i.e. bicycles, woodworking, leather belts)
- 50% of property will be dedicated to light industrial (truck repairs, automotive parts, HVAC). Will be able to train 100-300 people at a time
- Property will have greenspace for community events with food-related businesses
- The focus of the property is job creation, but will offer services to serve the people that work there and the public
- There will be 4-6 meeting between February and March regarding the site. Dates to be announced.
